




Residential Life Room Layout Guide




Double Room

Two (2) occupants residing in one (1) unit. Bedspace "a" is located on the lefthand side of the room with bedspace "b" on the righthand side.


Double Room Bunked

Two (2) occupants residing in one (1) unit. Bedspace "a" is located on the lower bed with bedspace "b" on the upper bed.




Triple Room

Three (3) occupants residing in one (1) unit. Bedspace "a" is the lower bed in the bunked beds with bedspace "b" on the upper bed. Bedspace "c" is the lofted bed (raised and standalone).




Triple Room No Bunks

Three (3) occupants residing in one (1) unit. Bedspace assignments follow a clockwise direction. Bedspace "a" is the first space clockwise from the door. Continuing clockwise, the next bedspace is "b" and the final bedspace is "c." They are all single beds (not bunks).




Quadruple Room

Four (4) occupants residing in one (1) unit. Bedspace "a" and bedspace "d" are the lower beds in the bunked beds with bedspace "b" and bedspace "c" on the upper beds.



Quad Room No Bunks

Four (4) occupants residing in one (1) unit. Bedspace assignments follow a clockwise direction. Bedspace "a" is the first space clockwise from the door. Continuing clockwise, the next bedspace is "b", the next bedspace is "c", and the final bedspace is "d." They are all loft beds (raised and standalone).
